Introduction

The Invitation

When we first began Mondays with Mary, I was elated to discover such a joyous, engaged response from my children about our new "Mary" time. While this was not their first exposure to Marian devotions, my previous approach (during school time) was not only met with boredom, but led to discouragement on my part. Mary, I realized, is not someone to "learn" about, she is someone to yearn for. She is not a project to be finished and then put away, she is a cherished gift from God; a refuge for us to return to again and again. She is Our Heavenly Mother.

We had always prayed the family rosary in the evening; we had prayed litanies, novenas, and carried out many May coronations. We marveled at the birth of Our Lord and at the *fiat* of his Mother, but we needed more. *I needed more*. What better way for a Catholic mother of four to instill our rich faith and most especially a faithful devotion to Our Blessed Mother than with a special focused devotion time? What better way to reach Jesus than through His ever-Virgin and faithful Mother? This was it! And so *Mondays with Mary* was born.

Mondays with Mary represents a glimpse into the life and heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary for our children. We as their parents are the windows to her world; we just need to open it for them. Let us go to Jesus through Mary!

The Inspiration

The inspiration for this book came one day as I pondered the *Litany of Loreto*. I was struck by the symbolism and joy of this litany and how it represents every aspect of Our Lady's life as a free, loving gift to the world. Dating back to the fourteenth century, the *Litany of Loreto* includes almost every reality of Mary we celebrate.

At the time, I had been receiving some beautiful novena notifications via email from one of my dearest friends, Alice Gunther, author of *Haystack Full of Needles: A Catholic Home Educator's Guide to Socialization* (Pennsylvania, Hillside Education, 2008). I received each message with joy, knowing I would be able to pray for a person in our online community and that Mary was taking all our prayers and devotions straight to Our Heavenly Father. This was so very meaningful and real for me that I wanted to share this practice with my dear children. Our Catholic faith is so rich in tradition

and symbolism that I wanted the *Litany of Loreto* to be a tradition-building tool that would create memories of our times together with Mother Mary.

For the past few years I have shared the content and activities of our *Mondays with Mary* through posts on my home education blog—*Sweetness and Light.* Because of the heartfelt joy and positive response from my readership, I felt called to put it into a book format so others could benefit from this Marian devotion and the many graces that flowed into our family as a result.

It is my deep desire that this book will enrich your life and bestow upon your family the grace of Our Lady and her Son, Jesus Christ. This is what *Mondays with Mary* is all about!

The Implementation

How then might we more fully appreciate all of Our Blessed Mother's feasts and apparitions? I have found that the *Litany of Loreto* provides a framework for celebrating Marian feasts throughout the liturgical year. I hope you will discover how using the *Litany* for hands-on devotion provides a powerfully effective focus for teaching your dear children about their heavenly Mother and making her seem more real to them — and you.

Each title found in the *Litany of Loreto* helps us to explore an aspect of Mary's life that the Church reverences and I have provided practical suggestions for celebrating at home. These suggestions include devotional activities, teatime recipe ideas, and other ways to remember Our Lady and her worthiness for feasting and celebrating! There are also some appendices at the back for you to peruse.

The format for this book is simple, straightforward, and can be expanded to include your own family customs and traditions. Because each feast is self-contained and none is a prerequisite for another, you can celebrate them all within each liturgical year cycle, or select the ones that are most convenient and special to your group or family and plan accordingly. The book is designed to be used each year, so it is just fine to pick and choose what suits your family.

Here are some suggestions to help you prepare. I offer the following as a blueprint for planning ahead for your Mondays with Mary, and to generate wonder and anticipation in your children. Although this book was developed mainly for home use, it would also work well for any small gathering within or outside your parish. If you travel this route, feel free to delegate some of the preparation. Perhaps one family could bring teatime

treats; another could bring beverages or craft supplies. Make it work for you in a simple and relaxed manner. Your focus, after all, is celebrating a feast in honor of Mary!

On your very first *Mondays with Mary*, prepare your environment with these essential elements:

1. Make a Marian space reflecting the theme of the feast

Whether it is in a separate nook in your home, on a special shelf, or the center of your kitchen table, this space will help your children focus on the feast you celebrate. For example, collect and display holy cards or pictures illustrating different aspects of Our Lady. Candles and flowers whether real or artificial are a nice touch. Perhaps a lovely seashell or a handmade rosary would make your space especially Marian. Let each feast day spark your imagination. Encourage your children to make their own contributions.

2. Prepare a Teatime Recipe

Within each feast you will find a suggested recipe for your teatime. These are simple to prepare. Some of the suggested recipes are feast specific or symbolic of the Marian celebration, but many are interchangeable and can be served on any of the feasts. Choose some and repeat them as you discover your favorites throughout the year if you wish. Just be sure to gather the ingredients you will need in advance. Also, you do not have to limit yourself to tea. There are certainly fruit juices, milk or water that could be used for any of these feast days. I encourage you to be creative whenever connections become clear. Please also be assured that any of your own family favorites may be more meaningful for a particular feast, so please feel free to select what you prefer, especially if your family has specific dietary needs.

3. Choose a Devotional Activity

I offer a variety of hands-on activities for you to consider. You need not create a craft for each feast but I can vouch for the fact that doing so will greatly increase the level of fun, devotion to Mary, and creativity when celebrating. Plus, who doesn't like to make special things?

For each craft activity, I provide directions and a list of materials. Again, I recommend gathering everything in advance so you can avoid scrambling at the last moment.

4. Learn More


To enhance your celebration with a picture book or read-aloud book, or DVD viewing suggestion, please review the selections offered in Appendix A.



Holy Name of Mary September 12

"O name of Mary! Joy in the heart, honey in the mouth, melody to the ear of her devout clients!" —St. Anthony of Padua

The Holy Name of Mary is the first title of Mary in the *Litany of Loreto*. Today's celebration is all about revering Our Lady's name. "Mary" in Latin is *Maria*, in Hebrew it is *Maryam*, and in Aramaic it is *Miryam*. From this, the name "Mary" has been derived and it is so precious to us who call on her. Eight days after the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in accordance with Jewish law, her parents, Saints Joachim and Anne, were inspired by their visions of angels to name her thus.

We do not really know much about Mary's parents, just how they yearned deeply for a child and implored God with fervent prayers, prayers God answered with the sweetest most delightful gift they—and we—could ever receive. It's important to note, too, that Saints Anne and Joachim are the grandparents of Our Lord. This is big!

"On this day dedicated to the Holy Name of Mary let us repeat that wonderful prayer of Saint Bernard: "Look to the star of the sea, call upon Mary ... in danger, in distress, in doubt, think of Mary, call upon Mary. May her name never be far from your lips, or far from your heart ... If you follow her, you will not stray; if you pray to her, you will not despair; if you turn your thoughts to her, you will not err. If she holds you, you will not fall; if she protects you, you need not fear; if she is your guide, you will not tire; if she is gracious to you, you will surely reach your destination." —Pope Benedict XVI (Address at Heiligenkreuz Abbey, September 9, 2007)

Teatime Chat

Do you know how you got your name? Did you know that God not only knew your name before you were born (Jeremiah 1:5) but knew how many hairs you would have on your head? (Luke 12:7) Have fun chatting today about how family members received their names. What does each name mean? Why is it special?

You might encourage the children to select or create a symbol for their names that they can use to decorate their notebooks or Marian scrapbooks as children of Mary and Jesus.

Thanking God for this feast of the *Holy Name of Mary* and for your family's special name days, ceremoniously mark each person's name day on the family calendar and chat about how these special days might be celebrated.

Devotional Activities (choose one or more)

♥ Letters of Her Holy Name

Supplies: 3- to 5- inch wood letters of your choice (one set or letter for each participant), acrylic craft paint in blue and white star, heart and flower stickers, Modge Podge™ or clear acrylic spray (optional).

Directions: Paint the large wooden letters blue or white to spell out M-A-R-Y, M-A-R-I-A, or A-V-E M-A-R-I-A and let dry. Decorate with the flower, star and heart stickers, seal with Modge Podge™ or clear acrylic spray if desired. Display on your Marian altar or at the dinner table.

♥ Cross-Stitch or Embroider Marian Symbols

Supplies: Assorted embroidery or cross stitch needles, assorted embroidery threads in blue, white, yellow or gold, fabric in white or blue, embroidery hoop, scissors.

Directions: Choose a Marian symbol to embroider or cross stitch and create a beautiful image for Our Lady. Try this simple "fleur de lis!"
